The Taunton Civic Chorus is mourning the passing of State Representative Carol Doherty. Carol was a long-time member and supporter of TCC.

Before entering politics, Carol was an educator – a teacher, then a guidance counselor. She served as President of the Massachusetts Teachers Association for four years. Carol took that background to serve as an education and political consultant at Lesley College and Northeastern University. She also served on The Taunton School Committee for four terms. From there, Carol served as state representative in the 3rd Bristol District until her death February 15th.



TCC's Season Halfway to Concert Time

A new season is underway for Taunton Civic Chorus. The Spring season began on Thursday, January 9th with Music Director Chris Hoskins leading singers, along with Assistant Music Director/Accompanist JJ Ward.

The spring concert entitled *Stevie!* will feature the music of Stevie Nicks, Stevie Wonder and other favorites such as Joni Mitchell, Bill Withers, and more.

Music Director Hoskins said the chorus will be singing such modern popular music such as "Landslide", "Sir Duke", "Edge of Seventeen", and "Big Yellow Taxi".



Hoskins describes the concert as, "a fitting tribute to two musical icons who helped shape modern popular music."

The Taunton Civic Chorus is the area's longest running choral group and has been an important part of the cultural life of Taunton since 1959. In addition to presenting an annual spring and holiday concert, the TCC performs at local events such the Liberty and Union Festival, Taunton River Festival, The Dighton Arts Festival, and Lights On -Taunton. Each year, TCC proudly awards a

scholarship to a young person entering college who has been involved in the performing arts in high school.

TCC to Award Scholarships to High Schoolers

Each year, Taunton Civic Chorus awards a scholarship(s) to area high school students. The \$800 scholarship is open to graduating seniors from greater Taunton area high schools: Taunton High School, Bridgewater-Raynham Regional High School, West Bridgewater High School, Dighton-Rehoboth Regional High School, Somerset-Berkley Regional High School, Apponequet Regional High School (Lakeville/Freetown), Middleborough High School, Norton High School.

The student must be a participant in an organized musical activity (chorus, band, orchestra, private voice or instrumental lessons, drama club, dance lessons), and be accepted into a 2 or 4-year college degree program, pursuing any major.

Applications are available through high school guidance/music departments, or taunton.ma.civic.chorus@gmail.com.

The deadline for applications is Monday, March 10th.

TCC Welcomes Newbies - Part 1
